
RE: National Public Affairs AZ-08 December Survey Findings

Key Findings

National Public Affairs recently completed a survey of 418 likely Republican primary voters in Arizona's 8th Congressional District (see methodology statement at conclusion of document).


Bolstered by endorsements from key Republican figures, Abe Hamadeh holds a commanding lead in the early stages of the Republican primary race to replace Congresswoman Debbie Lesko in Arizona's 8th Congressional District.

- On the uninformed ballot, Abe Hamadeh holds a 23-point lead over Blake Masters. The rest of the field remains in the low to mid-single digits. (See topline ballot graph below)
- With endorsements from both former President Donald Trump and 2022 Gubernatorial candidate Kari Lake, Abe Hamadeh has extensive runway to grow his lead as 58% of Republican primary voters are more likely to support him knowing he has been endorsed by former President Donald Trump (54% more likely with the Kari Lake endorsement).






 After Republican primary voters hear about the endorsements he has received, Abe Hamadeh's lead grows by 8-points. This is due in large part to him siphoning votes from both Blake Masters and previously undecided voters.



• If Blake Masters were to drop out of the Republican primary race for U.S. Congress, Abe Hamadeh's lead would increase further, increasing by 8-points as he would absorb the bulk of Masters' supporters.



• While over one-third of the electorate remains undecided, Abe Hamadeh is the clear frontrunner among Republican candidates in Arizona's 8th Congressional District primary race.
